Where does time go? We are already into the second half of 2011! As we celebrate the anniversary of our nation's independence, we are all thankful that we live in a country so blest. We must also be thankful to those wise and brave souls who pledged their lives, their fortunes and their sacred honor to bring forth this noble experiment.

We in the Knights of Columbus Assembly take our cue from such honorable men (and women). We address each other as "Faithful" Pilot, "Faithful" Purser, etc. and in Council, we say "Worthy" Grand Knight, "Worthy" Financial Secretary, etc. Think for a moment what these terms mean. #### Respect Life: Good News

I haven't written a Respect Life article for awhile because of family commitments and travels, but I am back now and just in time. There is great news in Ohio and around the country for respect life advocates.

The Ohio legislature recently sent a budget to Governor Kasich for his signature. This budget contains several Pro-Life amendments and features:

One amendment bans abortions from being performed in public hospitals

Another prohibits abortion coverage in insurance plans of local public employees

The budget requires the Department of Health to apply for federal abstinence education grants to reduce the number of unplanned pregnancies

The final pro-life amendment preserves the right of student groups to use and benefit from school funds and facilities, therefore protecting the rights of pro-life groups on college campuses.

Pro-Life Governor Kasich was expected to sign the budget bill on June 30.

The Ohio House has passed Pro-Life bills and sent them to the Senate for their approval:

House Bill 78 bans late term abortions (after 20 weeks gestation)

House Bill 79 prohibits coverage of abortion in state health insurance exchanges established under the federal healthcare reform bill (Obamacare)

Sub House Bill 125 (known as the Heartbeat Bill) is a historic bill to prohibit abortion of unborn babies once a heartbeat is detected,

as early as 6-9 weeks gestation.

These House Bills have been sent to the Senate for consideration and vote. Please contact your state Senator and tell him to support all three of these important pro-life bills. As good Catholics and Knights, we must protect the lives and rights of the most vulnerable among us, the unborn.

Elsewhere, <u>Kansas is poised to become the first abortion free state</u> after the Kansas Department of Health and Environment denied an abortion license to Planned Parenthood under a new law set to go into full effect on Friday, July 1. Earlier, all three Planned Parenthood abortion mills in Kansas were notified that they would not be granted licenses based on information provided in their applications and the safety regulations required by the new law. Of course, Planned Parenthood immediately filed suit against the law. If the law is upheld, Kansas would no longer have any abortion mills in operation and would therefore become the first abortion free state.

Apparently, none of the abortion mills gave any consideration to actually complying with the safety requirements of the new law to keep their licenses - perhaps because it would cut into their profits?

While all this is wonderful news for Respect Life advocates, we must continue to keep up the good fight and spread the Culture of Life wherever we are through our words and actions.
